### PUT JESUS FIRST.

Thankfully, most of us don't face such a conflict. We can rejoice in God and in family, as Paul does in today's Second Reading.

## CHILD PROTECTION SUNDAY 8TH SEPTEMBER 2019

Child Protection Sunday provides us with an opportunity to celebrate the presence of children and young people in our Archdiocese and parishes, as we continue to encourage our community to be a safe environment for all.

This day forms part of National Child Protection Week, a national initiative to engage members of the community in supporting families and protecting children. The 2019 theme for this week is promoting messages about child development, such as "kids do well when parents are supported".

Child Protection Sunday is a time to not only reflect on the deep impact of abuse, but also to bring light to the initiatives we have in place to safeguard all children and young people.

As an Archdiocese, we believe that children and young people have the right to be safe, happy and healthy. This is our shared responsibility – to be a community committed to the care, wellbeing and protection of our children and young people.

For this reason, this year to celebrate child protection week, we are giving families a pen and bookmark with a message about their right to feel safe, happy, respected, listen to, and welcome in their church. The pen also represents the tools we give children and young people in our church to communicate with adults.

We want children to have a say, to feel that the church is a safe and child friendly environment where they can express themselves, where they can speak up to adults who care about them and are willing to listen.

We welcome you to join us after 10am Mass for Morning Tea to celebrate Children and Young People in our Parish.

Pens and Bookmarks are also available for each family with Children at each Mass this weekend.

Learn their names, get to know them – make them feel special.



Your commitment to Jesus might cause friction at home, but don't misunderstand the Gospel, Jesus says to "hate" people, but according to Scripture scholars, he doesn't mean we should feel hatred. He means we should choose God's will over all people and

things. And that should make us treat family and friends with more love. If your faith choices do cause friction at home, here are some tips for responding with love. **Talk and listen** - Many parents just want to know what you're up to. Make time to discuss your faith choices with them.

**Be patient** - Many parents struggle with faith. That can make it hard for them to understand yours.

**Value family time** - Don't forget that discipleship calls us to serve our families, not just our parishes, youth groups, and the poor.

**Seek help** - If tension is high at home, find someone to dialogue with who can help you choose a Christian response.

**Give them a break** - It's tough raising young people – even a Christian one. *Weekly Parables for Catholic Parishes*

### Feast Days of the Week

**Fri Sep 13 St John Chrysostom (347-407)**

One of the greatest Early Church Fathers of the 5th Century, St John was born in 347 AD. St. John became a monk and was ordained a priest where his eloquent preaching on the Sacred Scriptures in Antioch earned him the title of 'Chrysostom', meaning 'golden-mouthed'.

**Sat Sep 14 The Exaltation of the Holy Cross**

Also known as Feast of the Triumph of the Cross. The Cross is the most potent and universal symbol of the Christian faith. The cross is a symbolic summary of the Passion, Crucifixion and Resurrection of Christ – all in one image. Rather than being a symbol of shame, faith in the resurrection makes the cross a symbol of pride.
