ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

As we follow the liturgy of Eastertide, we notice that the first Reading usually selected from the Old Testament is replaced by passages from the Acts of the Apostles which focuses on the missionary journeys of the Apostles, Peter, Paul and also Phillip and Barnabas, to the Jews and Gentiles.

The Acts of the Apostles is a sequel to Luke's Gospel and begins with the Ascension when the Risen Jesus tells His Apostles "you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you and you will be My witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria and to the ends of the earth".

After Pentecost, the Apostles went forth and spread the Good News with great enthusiasm despite the opposition and trials they endured. While the Sunday readings reveal to us some knowledge of the early Christian church communities, it is worthwhile to read the complete account from the Bible. There we discover how many journeys the Apostles undertook, despite the hardships. We also see many signs and wonders, including miracles and healings, which were witnessed by many people.

The main focus of the Acts is on the activities of the Christian missionaries and communities spread through Jerusalem, Antioch, Corinth, Ephesus and several cities in the Roman Empire. From these narratives we see how these communities of believers lived in Christian Fellowship – sharing possessions and caring for the needs of the poor. They also spent time together in the Temple and 'broke bread' at home and, above all, praising God and having good will for all people.

The Acts of the Apostles highlights the continuity between the story of Jesus and the early church communities and also, importantly, the continuity between the Church story and the expansion of Christianity *to the ends of the earth*.

Those people preaching the Gospel were ordinary people with human limitations, but when they listened and followed the promptings of the Holy Spirit, they set the world on fire even *to the ends of the earth*.

CHILD SAFE ENVIRONMENTS BRIEFING FOR VOLUNTEERS

As you may be aware, ALL volunteers in our Archdiocese are mandated notifiers under the South Australian Child Protection Legislation. To ensure we hear the voices of children and have the necessary skills to identify and respond appropriately, we invite any volunteers who have not yet participated in Child Safe Environments training or an equivalent course to attend a 90 minute Volunteer Briefing session facilitated by the Archdiocesan Child Protection Unit. Please note that these briefings (or an equivalent course) are a compulsory requirement for anyone wishing to be a Eucharistic Minister.

A Volunteer Briefing will be held in our Parish on Thursday 1st August 10:30am at St Thomas More Function Centre - 19 Laverstock Rd, Elizabeth North.

Note: If you have attended a Child Safe Environments or RAN training within the past 3 years you do not need to attend a Volunteer Briefing.

Please note: If you do not book in you may not be able to join the briefing on the day due to the number of participants - so make that call ASAP and reserve your place.

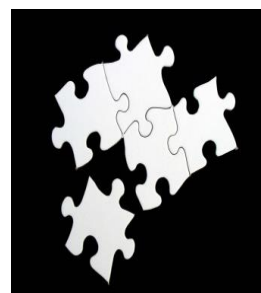
