EASTER SUNDAY MORNING IN 1942 AND 2019

As we are all aware, suicide bombers struck three churches on Easter Sunday morning around the island nation of Sri Lanka.

Two Catholic Churches, St. Antony's, a popular shrine in the capital, Colombo, St. Sebastian's in Negombo, north of the capital, where 102 people died; and the Zion Church, in the eastern port city of Batticaloa.

Also targeted were three luxury hotels which are mostly frequented by foreign tourists.

Strangely enough, as Anzac Day approaches, I remembered that this is now the second time in history that the Indian Ocean island of Sri Lanka has been bombed on an Easter Sunday morning when the faithful were at prayer. The first was a coordinated air attack on the capital Colombo, launched from aircraft carriers of the Imperial Japanese Navy at 7:30 a.m. on Easter Sunday, April 5, 1942 — the same date that the US Pacific Fleet in Pearl Harbor was also attacked in a different time zone.

It would now appear that the death toll from these most recent attacks is well over three hundred with a further five hundred seriously injured.

Many of you may have seen Fr. Jude Fernando, the Parish Priest of St. Antony's who survived the recent attack interviewed on media news services.

In a world where many of us would see revenge for this atrocity as a standard and justifiable response, Fr. Jude expressed in the clearest terms that revenge for this most recent atrocity was not the way ahead in the contemporary world.

He clearly pointed out that the message of Easter, which defines the Christian reality and ethic is tolerance and forgiveness for those who attack us and seek to harm us.

He pleaded with his people and the world not to seek retribution and vengeance but to manifest forgiveness and love and to offer peace and stability in our lives regardless of the provocations confronting us.

As I watched the news broadcast and listened to his plea for peace I realised that here was a man who has heard the message of the resurrected Christ and not only listened to it but embraced it with his whole being.

Easter truly lives on within his mind and in true reality, in his heart.

The Real Easter message to our world.

FEAR DIVISION NOT DIFFERENCE

"No one should be afraid that God has allowed there to be different religions in the world," Pope Francis

said. "But we should be frightened if we are not doing the work of fraternity, of walking together in life as brothers and sisters of one human family," he said. People might ask themselves, "Why is it the Pope visits Muslims and not just Catholics?" he said. "Catholics and Muslims are both descendants of the same father, Abraham," he said, "and the trip was another step on a journey of dialogue and encounter with (our) Muslim brothers and sisters." The Pope said he wanted to follow in the footsteps of two great saints: St. Francis of Assisi, who brought a "message of peace and fraternity" to Sultan al-Malik al-Kami 800 years ago, and St. John Paul II, who visited Morocco in 1985. He said people also may wonder why God allows there to be so many different religions in the world. "Some theologians say it is part of God's "permissive will," allowing this reality of many religions. Some emerge from the culture, but they always look toward heaven and God," the pope said. "What God wants is fraternity among us," he said, "which is why we must not be frightened by difference. God has allowed this. But it is right to be worried when people are not working toward a more fraternal world," he added. **CathNews**


