"WE WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU"

Child Protection Week this year will be nationally recognised from the 1st to the 7th of September. Similar to other years, we will be celebrating Child Protection Sunday on the second Sunday in September, this year being the **8th September 2019**.

The Archdiocese recently started their Children's consultation process and have distributed feedback boxes and activity booklets to all parishes during a Child Safe Forum. Empowerment of children and young people is the 1st Goal. For that reason, they wish to deliver the message that it is important for us to hear the voices of children and young people who are involved in the Catholic Church.

Prior to Child Protection Sunday - there will be Child Protection Unit booklets for Children/Young people aged 7 to 18 years old available which contain activities and a questionnaire on the back. Children/Young people aged 7 to 18 years old are invited to fill in this booklet to help us to develop a better understanding of how they experience our church, what makes them feel safe, valued, welcomed, and how our Archdiocese is currently supporting their rights. It is anonymous and an adult can help fill it in. Please return the Questionnaire to any Mass Centre and place it in the box titled "We want to hear from You".

This is a great way of children being given the opportunity to be heard - so please encourage them to have a say. The Pamphlets will be available next weekend - along with the "We Want To Hear From You Boxes" awaiting all your responses. Please note that if the questionnaire doesn't provide enough room for the responses, please use a separate piece of paper.

HOW WILL YOU DEAL WITH CONFLICT AS A CHRISTIAN?

Feast Days of the Week

Tue Aug 20 St Bernard of Clairvaux 1090-1153

One of the great figures in the Benedictine tradition, St Bernard founded the monastery of Clairvaux and later went on to found 163 monasteries in Europe. After the fall of Edessa in 1144, Pope Eugene III commissioned Bernard to preach the Second Crusade - which later proved to be a failure. Canonised in 1174, Bernard was recognised as a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius VIII in 1829.

Wed Aug 21 St Pius X 1835-1914

Born Giuseppe Sarto he was appointed Bishop of Mantua in 1884 and succeeded Leo XIII as Pope from 1903 to 1914. Encouraging the frequent reception of Holy Communion he was given the honorific title of 'Pope of the Blessed Sacrament'. He was canonised in 1954.

Thu Aug 22 The Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The words of Pius XII well describe the Queenship of Mary: 'Jesus, the Son of God, reflects on His heavenly Mother the glory, the majesty and the dominion of His kingship, for, having been associated to the King of Martyrs in the unspeakable work of human Redemption as Mother and co-operator, she remains forever associated to Him, with a practically unlimited power, in the distribution of the graces which flow from the Redemption. Jesus is King throughout all eternity by nature and by right of conquest: through Him, with Him, and subordinate to Him, Mary is Queen by grace, by divine relationship, by right of conquest, and by singular choice [of the Father]. And her kingdom is as vast as that of her Son and God, since nothing is excluded from her dominion.'

Sat Aug 24 St Bartholomew, Apostle

One of the Twelve Apostles, mentioned sixth in the list of the Apostles given in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, and seventh in the list of Acts (1:13). No other mention is made of Bartholomew in the New Testament but some scholars speculate that he may be the same person as Nathaniel who is mentioned only in John's Gospel whereas Bartholomew is not.
