ASH WEDNESDAY 2021

As with a lot of traditional practices in our society including family weddings, funerals, birthdays, and social gatherings, unique national events including AFL, the Melbourne Cup, Test Cricket and many cultural imperatives in our sporting and national traditions this year has seen a range of modifications to our personal imperatives due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Anzac Day, as you know, was severely impacted in its essential elements throughout the whole of the Nation with almost every ceremony modified or cancelled.

As we draw closer to the Lenten season again we are, therefore, not particularly surprised to find that, just as we experienced last year there will be a degree of modification to certain liturgical traditions.

One of the traditions which has become difficult again this year is with regard to the imposition of ashes during the Ash Wednesday liturgy.

You may be aware that the Vatican has, in recent days, issued a decree that the imposition of ashes should be achieved by "sprinkling" the ashes on the head of the recipient with no physical contact by the minister with the recipient.

While we acknowledge the veracity of this directive, we do however have questions regarding the practical implementation of this advice in the current situation.

It would appear that the time constraint involved may be very difficult and the distancing parameter may prove to be equally difficult. Ministers of Word or Communion cannot be incorporated into this scenario.

I have, therefore, decided that the only practical alternative would be that those who wish to avail themselves of this process should approach me personally <u>after Mass</u> in order that the ashes can be received carefully with no physical contact in order to meet the imperative of the protocol.

I would also like to take this opportunity to expand the number of extraordinary ministers of Communion involved in the celebration of the Eucharist on Sundays as some seem to feel that they would be really pleased to be nominated to assist in these celebrations.

If you feel called to this ministry please let me know that you are available as soon as possible. I conclude by thanking all of you who have continued to exercise your ministries so diligently and generously during these difficult times.

Be assured of my gratitude for all you have done.

5th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR B

JESUS TOOK HER BY THE HAND

We sometimes come to Mass poor, sick and troubled, much like the people who crowd around the door of Jesus in today's Gospel. In this Mass let us express our needs to Jesus. Let us ask him to take us by the hand and help us as he helped Simon's mother-in-law. Then, with our spirits uplifted, we will go out from Mass with a renewed desire to share God's love with others.

First Reading - A reading from the prophet Job - I am filled with sorrow all day long.

Job began to speak:

Is not man's life on earth nothing more than pressed service,

his time no better than hired drudgery? Like the slave, sighing for the shade, or the workman with no thought but his wages, months of delusion I have assigned to me, nothing for my own but nights of grief. Lying in bed I wonder, 'When will it be day?' Risen I think, 'How slowly evening comes!' Restlessly I fret till twilight falls. Swifter than a weaver's shuttle my days have passed, and vanished, leaving no hope behind. Remember that my life is but a breath, and that my eyes will never again see joy.

The word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

Responsorial Psalm: - *R. Praise the Lord who heals the broken-hearted.*

Praise the Lord for he is good; sing to our God for he is loving: to him our praise is due. R.

The Lord builds up Jerusalem and brings back Israel's exiles, he heals the broken-hearted, he binds up all their wounds. he fixes the number of the stars; he calls each one by its name. R.

Our Lord is great and almighty; his wisdom can never be measured. The Lord raises the lowly; he humbles the wicked to the dust. R

Second Reading: - A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians - Punishment will come to me if I do not preach the Gospel.

I do not boast of preaching the gospel, since it is a duty which has been laid on me; I should be punished if I did not preach it! If I had chosen this work myself, I might have been paid for it, but as I have not, it is a responsibility which has been put into my hands. Do you know what my reward is? It is this: in my preaching, to be able to offer the Good News free, and not insist on the rights which the gospel gives me.

So though I am not a slave of any man I have made myself the slave of everyone so as to win as many as I could. For the weak I made myself weak. I made myself all things to all men in order to save some at any cost; and I still do this, for the sake of the gospel, to have a share in its blessing.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! He bore our sickness, and endured our suffering. Alleluia!

GOSPEL: - A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark - He cured many who suffered from diseases of one kind or another.

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-in-law had gone to bed with fever, and they told him about her straightaway. He went to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. And the fever left her and she began to wait on them.

That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick and those who were possessed by devils. The whole town came crowding round the door, and he cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another; he also cast out many devils, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was.

In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there. Simon and his companions set out in search of him, and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can preach there too, because that is why I came.' And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out devils.
