'UNLESS YOU REPENT'.

When misfortune strikes people considered to be sinners, others might say: 'They had it coming! God is punishing them!' In today's Gospel Jesus criticises such attitudes on two grounds. Firstly, it is wrong to see the wrath of God in every tragic event. Secondly, we need to recognise that we are all guilty of sin and in need of conversion. Instead of judging others, let us ask God to forgive our sins and help us as we undertake the difficult task of reform.

BE PATIENT!



The gospel today may seem a bit odd to us. Most of us don't cultivate fig trees and we don't generally have gardeners. So, let's substitute a rose bush, one that we planted three years ago and so far has not produced a single rose.

We very likely would dig it out and replace it with a plant that will produce. Whether figs or roses, the point of today's gospel is that God does not give up on us. We get chance after chance to "produce". This Lent we can imitate the patience and love of God by not expecting those around us to always produce, achieve, or succeed according to our expectations. God trusts that each will bear fruit in his or her own time, and if that's good enough for God, why are we so impatient! Patience ... Today's gospel gives us much food for thought though we perhaps don't think of it as a lesson about patience. Yet the gardener who begs for one more year is clearly calling for this difficult-to-practice virtue. We need patience with our spouse, our children, our coworkers, our friends; we need to let them grow at the pace God has set for them. Think about this today and be patient in small ways that you might pave the way for patience in greater things.

You, O God, are like a great gardener who allows me to grow at my own pace. May I imitate your patience and love with those around me. Give me the grace this Lent to bloom and grow, and give me the patience to let others do the same. I give you praise, great gardener. Amen.

THE WATERS TO CREATE MANY RIPPLES.' ST TERESA OF CALCUTTA

Sixteen-year-old Peter goes to a boarding school in the Solomon Islands which has experienced water shortages for 60 years. Previously students would have to walk kilometres each day in search of clean water. This was particularly challenging for Peter who is living with a disability. Peter's mother left the family when he was little and has since passed away. His father decided to move from northern Malaita to Honiara, to better provide for his family. He arranged for Peter to stay with his aunt, then attend Aligegeo Secondary School. Groundwater sources at the school have dried up and rainfall is unpredictable. Water in surrounding wells often made students sick or gave them rashes. Caritas Australia, and partners Caritas Solomon Islands (CASI) and the Solomon Islands Government Rural Water Sanitation and Hygiene division (RWASH), have teamed up with the school to tackle the problem. CASI provided a 90 kilo-litre water tank, electric pump and technical advice, while the Malaita Provincial Government contributed labour. Staff and students took part in training, dug trenches and are helping with a water management plan. The school now has a safe, reliable water system, servicing around 1,000 people. "Now we can stay at school to wash and not interrupt our official class time," Peter hopes to focus on his education and to help others in future by working for an aid and development agency himself. However much more needs to be done to improve access to reliable water and sanitation in the Solomon Islands. Envelopes or boxes are available in the foyer of the Church.



"He said to the gardener, 'For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none." (LUKE 13:7).

We can all be like the barren fig tree at times. Do you cling to what you have, or do you generously share with others? How will you respond when God asks you what you have done with all the gifts He has given you? Remember, not only are we called to be generous, we are called to develop and nurture our gifts and return with increase.


