THIRTEEN DAYS IN OCTOBER

Many of us are old enough to remember 1962 and the dramatic events of October that year when a sense of foreboding permeated our world and society and we all held our breath for thirteen days.

It was all about Cuba.

The confrontation between the armed forces of the Soviet Union and those of the United States who faced off in a crisis which impacted our peace of mind and our sense of security caused a wave of fear bordering on panic throughout the world.

I must admit that in recent days I have experienced a tendency to revisit, to some extent, that feeling of insecurity and those emotions again.

Although not yet so dramatic and confronting as in 1962 we live again in dangerous times and the outcome of the posturing of nations in our own region of the world is causing discomfort and insecurity for many people.

We observe some very serious and unpredictable political manoeuvring and military rearming by the most powerful nations in our region and there is a perception and even fear that things could quite easily spiral out of control unless there is a degree of self-restraint and compromise by all parties involved.

The confrontation in the areas bordering the South China Sea and the rapid unprecedented move towards growth in Military spending and ramping up of capability of those nations in our region and a growing belligerence on the part of many must give us all some degree of insecurity towards the future.

It is in this type of situation that we are afraid that a lack of restraint and wisdom by any individual nation could impact on all of us in a catastrophic scenario.

Aware of this reality we pray for wisdom and the guidance of the Holy Spirit for the leaders of our own country and respective neighbour nations that there would be a quest for peace and calm and that the reality of this quest will be reciprocated throughout all the nations of South East Asia and the South Pacific area.

May Peace be with us all.

When Jesus received the news of John the Baptist's death He withdrew by boat to a lonely place where they could be by themselves. But the people heard of this and, leaving the towns, went after Him on foot. So as He stepped ashore He saw a large crowd; and He took pity on them and healed their sick.

"This is a lonely place, and the time has slipped by; so send the people away, and they can go to the villages to buy themselves some food." Jesus replied, "There is no need for them to go: give them something to eat yourselves." But they answered, "All we have with us is five loaves and two fish." "Bring them to me," He said. He gave orders that the people sit down on the grass; then He took the five loaves and the two fish, raised His eyes to heaven and said the blessing. And breaking the loaves He handed them to His disciples who gave them to the crowds. They all ate as much as they wanted, and they collected the scraps remaining, twelve baskets full. Those who ate numbered about five thousand men, to say nothing of women and children.


