CATHOLIC AGENCIES AND SCHOOLS UNITE TO END SLAVERY

Hundreds of Catholic schools and agencies across Australia are showing their commitment to buy and eat only slavery-free chocolate this Easter.

As part of an awareness campaign this Lent, the Australian Catholic Religious Against Trafficking in Humans (ACRATH) is drawing attention to the use of child slavery in West Africa, which produces cocoa beans for chocolate.

Australians spent about \$210 million on Easter chocolate last year. A lot of this chocolate is made using cocoa beans produced in West Africa using children, who are working for little or no wages.

The International Labor Rights Forum estimates there are 1.5 million children working in the cocoa sector in West Africa. It is estimated that up to 40 million people are trapped in slavery globally – one in four of these are children.

ACRATH president Sr Noelene Simmons sm said choosing slavery-free chocolate was a simple gesture that had the potential to change lives. She added there were now many slavery free certification labels on chocolate, as well as the three better-known symbols.

People can buy slavery-free chocolate in big supermarkets and smaller shops. The easiest way to tell if your chocolate is slavery-free is to check if it has one of these commonly used certification symbols on the wrapping, she said.

Last month Pope Francis said that faced with the tragic reality of modern slavery, "no one can wash their hands of it, without being in some way, an accomplice to this crime against humanity". He urged people to work together, through grass roots action and corporate governance, to end slavery around the world.

PROJECT COMPASSION



SALMA FROM
BANGLADESH

Salma lives with her husband, Masud, in the rural community of Gazipur, two hours from Bangladesh's bustling capital.

She was just 18 years old, pregnant and fearful for her life and that of her unborn child, when she featured in Project Compassion 2013.

In Bangladesh, maternal and infant mortality rates are still tragically high. During her first pregnancy, Salma was very sick, she experienced abdominal pain and couldn't eat. She sought the help of a midwife called Pronoti, trained by Caritas Australia's Safe Motherhood Program.

Pronoti helped Salma safely through two pregnancies, thanks to her comprehensive training in midwifery, antenatal and postnatal care.

The program has reduced maternal and infant mortality in the area by almost 70 percent. Over 400 women have been trained in midwifery since 2008 – and they have given over 28,000 women antenatal checkups and delivered more than 15,000 babies.

Now 24, Salma smiles as she watches her one-year-old boy and six-year-old daughter play together. She is pleased that they are growing up strong and can focus on their hopes for the future.

"If the Safe Motherhood Program had not trained midwives like Pronoti, many of us would have to go to the private clinics 11 kilometres away. Some of us women and our babies might die because of that."

"We are poor and so it is easy to get discouraged about the future. However, if we have hope, we have the courage to try and do things that seem difficult or impossible at the time." **Envelopes or boxes are** available in the foyer of the Church.

PLENARY COUNCIL

The Plenary Council's Listening and Dialogue phase ended earlier this month, concluding a period of almost 10 months for people to share their stories and consider the question "What do you think God is asking of us in Australia at this time?" The National Centre for Pastoral Research has compiled statistical data and reported that 222,000 than people participated in the Listening and Dialogue phase and made either individual submissions or had their voices captured through a group response.


