#### HE GREW UP IN ELIZABETH.

Quite often when I celebrate the end of academic year liturgies with the students, staff and families of our local community I find myself referring to the successful academic achievements of past members of the Elizabeth area most of whom were the children of migrant parents and families.

This reality became more poignant for me in the past few weeks when I offered Requiem Mass at the funeral for a deceased past president of the AMA who was an incredibly successful medical specialist and a devout and committed Catholic layman.

He was not only highly intelligent and a devoted family man but he was deeply involved in the life of the church in many areas of liturgy and social issues.

He grew up in Elizabeth as an English migrant.

He is one of the reasons that I like to point out to the graduating students in our local schools the reality that many of the high achievers in Australia and a variety of countries and professions began their personal journey in our area.

I will always remember my first personal encounter with this man in the Hectorville parish.

It was one Wednesday afternoon when I had returned to the presbytery after working at the RAAF base at Edinburgh as a reserve chaplain and was still wearing my service uniform.

He remarked to me that he had until recently been wearing the same uniform having not long ago separated from the service as one of the doctors on the Base and that he had called in to pick up the music portfolio for the next Sunday masses where he was deeply involved in the liturgy in a variety of ways.

Over the years that followed we shared many stories and experiences on the Squash Court, Golf Course and over a few "lemonades."

The enigmatic reality in all of this was that a major consideration in his life was his work as a profoundly successful Medical Specialist, his dedication to the Church, Liturgical music, his family and beating me on the golf course and squash court.

Totally dedicated in all these areas of his life he never forgot his roots, his family, his talents, the Church and his relationship with God.

As a sideline he was one of the most highly regarded people in South Australia as a Medical Specialist.

Phil Harding was a migrant who grew up in Elizabeth.

#### 15TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR B

#### THE MISSION OF THE TWELVE

Before sending out the Twelve on a missionary journey, Jesus talks to them in great detail about how they are to dress and behave while on the mission. Amos replied to Amaziah, 'I was a shepherd, and looked after sycamores: but it was the Lord who took me from herding the flock, and the Lord who said, "Go, prophesy to my people Israel."

which he has showered on us in all wisdom and insight.

the hidden plan he so kindly made in Christ from the beginning to act upon when the times had run their course to the end:

that he would bring everything together under Christ, as head,

everything in the heavens and everything on earth.
